

## *Beartooth Boarding and Riding (BBR) Horse Health Program*

### Entry Requirements:

**Negative Coggins Test** within the last year and **Veterinary Health Certificate/ Inspection** within 10 days of arrival\*

\*If you are traveling from out of State we may require a more current test for EIA (Coggins Test) depending on recent outbreaks and the health certificate will require a permit number to enter the State with the Beartooth Ranch listed as the destination.

*Upon arrival, BBR reserves the right to quarantine any horse for any amount of time we deem necessary if the circumstances warrant the need, or if there is suspicion or doubt that the horse could've been exposed to any contagious disease even with a current health certificate or Coggins test.*

### \*\*Vaccinations:

- **Spring/ Annually (by end of May or upon entry)** – 5 way vaccine (Eastern/Western Encephalomyelitis, Influenza, Rhinopneumonitis, Tetanus)
- **Optional/ Recommended** – Rabies, West Nile\*  
\*May become required based on vet recommendation.
- **Fall/ Booster (by the end of Nov)** – Flu and Rhino booster

### Worming (or fecal test):

**Spring and Fall Required.** One application each year should have a tapeworm additive. Veterinarians and BBR highly recommend doing fecal tests instead of de-worming to help with the increasing risk of parasite resistance to de-wormers. If you choose to get a fecal test done, please provide BBR with the test results and what, if any, wormer was given.

\*\*This is a consensus derived from vets that would do what is best for all the horses at BBR. These are minimum requirements and we know most of you have a program for your horse or with your vet that is on going and more comprehensive. To help boarders comply with our requirements we do arrange for a couple local vets to come to the ranch in the spring and fall. It is up to the owners to meet the requirements, if we can assist you in any way, please let us know. Please inform us when your horses are done and what was done, by presenting receipts for purchases you made to administer them yourself or vet receipts.
